



No. 445312 John Bernard Croak, Canadian Expeditionary Force, 13th Bn.



Born in Little Bay on May 18, 1892. He moved with his parents James and Cecilia Croak to Glace Bay, N.S., where he attended New Aberdeen and St. John's schools before working as a coal miner. In 1915, he joined the 55th Bn., later transferring to the 13th Bn.

For most conspicuous bravery in attack when having become separated from his section he encountered a machine gun nest, which he bombed and silenced, taking the gun and crew prisoners. Shortly afterwards he was severely wounded, but refused to desist. Having rejoined his

platoon, a very strong point, containing several machine guns, was encountered. Private Croak, however, seeing an opportunity, dashed forward alone and was almost immediately followed by the remainder of the platoon in a brilliant charge. He was the first to arrive at the trench line, into which he led his men, capturing three machine guns and bayonetting or capturing the entire garrison. The perseverance and valour of this gallant soldier,who was again severely wounded, and died of his wounds, were an inspiring example to all.

No. 3102 Pte. Thomas Ricketts, 1st Bn. R. Newfoundland R.



Born on April 15, 1901 in Middle Arm, White Bay, Newfoundland, Ricketts enlisted aged 15 and 4 months into the 1st Bn, Royal Newfoundland Regiment during the First World War.

For most conspicuous bravery and devotion to duty on the 14th October, 1918, during the advance from Ledeghem, when the attack was temporarily held up by heavy hostile fire and the platoon to which he belonged suffered severe casualties from the fire of a battery at point-blank range.

Pte. Ricketts at once volunteered to go forward with his section commander and a Lewis gun to attempt to outflank the battery. Advancing by short rushes under heavy fire from enemy machine guns with the hostile battery, their ammunition was exhausted when still 300 yards from the battery. The enemy, seeing an opportunity to get their field guns away, began to bring

up their gun teams. Pte. Ricketts, at once realising the situation, doubled back 100 yards under the heaviest machine-gun fire, procured further ammunition, and dashed back again to the Lewis gun, and by very accurate fire drove the enemy and the gun teams into a farm.

His platoon then advanced without casualties, and captured the four field guns, four machine guns, and eight prisoners.

A fifth field gun was subsequently intercepted by fire and captured.

By his presence of mind in anticipating the enemy intention and his utter disregard of personal safety, Pte. Ricketts secured the further supply of ammunition which directly resulted in these important captures and undoubtedly saved many lives."

John Breen enlisted, September 2nd, 1914; British Mediterranean Expeditionary Force, August 20th, 1915; British Expeditionary Force, March 14th, 1916; Killed in Action, Beaumont Hamel, July 1st, 1916.






Andrew Brooks Baird

Andrew Brooks Baird was born in Glasgow, Sotland on 21st June, 1897. He joined the Royal Highland Fussiliers in 1915, demobilized on March 27th, 1919. He moved to Grand Falls, Newfoundland in 1923. He passed away on 28th July, 1978.





Abel Churchill Service #: 5411

Abel Churchill served with the Royal Newfoundland Regiment from 1914 to 1918. He is deceased.

John Cleary Service #: 288

John Cleary enlisted September 8th, 1914; British Mediterranean Expeditionary Force, August 20th, 1915; Evacuated Sulva, sick, November 25th, 1915; Rejoined Battalion, January 31st, 1916; British Expeditionary Force, March 14th, 1916; Killed in Action, Beaumont Hamel, July 1st, 1916.





Ephriam Cooper Service #: 4056

Ephriam Cooper was born on 5th October, 1894 in Trinity Bay, Newfoundland. He served with the Royal Newfoundland Regiment from 31st October 1917 to 5th July 1919. He served in France and Belgium "B Company" 5th Platoon until the end of the war. He is deceased.





John Bernard Croak Service #: 445312

John Bernard Croak was born in Little Bay, Newfoundland on 18th May, 1892. He enlisted with the 55th Bn Canadian Expeditionary Force in 1916 later transferring to the 13th Bn. He was awarded the Victoria Cross for most conspicuous bravery.

Bernard Delaney was born on Gull Island, Newfoundland in November 1985. He served with the Royal Newfoundland Regiment from 1st May, 1916 to 1st February, 1919. He is a past member of Carbonear Branch # 23 of The Royal Canadian Legion. He is deceased.





William Patrick Dohaney Service #: 496

William Patrick Dohaney was born in St. John's, Newfoundland on 6th February, 1892. He served with the 1st Bn Royal Newfoundland Regiment from 14th September 1914 to 1st July 1916. He was killed in action on 1st July 1916 in France. He is buried in Beaumont Hamel.

He enlisted with the Royal Newfoundland Regiment on 2nd September, 1914; British Mediterranean Expeditionary Force, August 10th, 1915; British Expeditionary Force, March 14th, 1916; Evacuated to hospital on July 15th, 1917; Rejoined the Battalion on October 14th, 1917; Wounded, Mesnieres, December 3rd, 1917; Invalided to England, December 9th, 1917; Attached to Depot, Ayr, February 18th, 1918; Embarked for Newfoundland, furlough, July 12th, 1918; Demobilized to St. John's, February 15th, 1919. He passed away on November 6th, 1947.

Thomas Ricketts Service #: 3102

Thomas Ricketts was born in Middle Arm, White Bay, Newfoundland on 15th April, 1901. He enlisted at the age of 15 years and 4 months into the 1st Bn, Royal Newfoundland Regiment during the First World War. He was awarded the Victoria Cross for most conspicuous bravery and devotion to duty on 14th October, 1918.





Horatius Seaward Service #: 172

Horatius Seaward was born in Clarenville, Newfoundland. He enlisted on September 8th, 1916; with the British Mediterranean Expeditionary Force on 20th August, 1915; Evacuated, Suvla, November 24th, 1915; Invalided to England, November 24th, 1915; British Expeditionary Force, December 12th, 1916; He was Killed in Action on 16th August, 1917 in Steenbeke.





Andrew Shaw Service #: 2740

Andrew Shaw was born in Little Heart's Ease, Trinity Bay, Newfoundland on September 30th, 1893. He served with the Royal Newfoundland Regiment. He passed away on 10th April, 1976.

Abram J. Verge Service #: 1925

Abram J. Verge was born in Winterton, Trinity Bay, Newfoundland. He enlisted in the British Army while he was attending Bishops Field College to further his teaching education on 22nd October, 1915. He left for France in 1916. On April 14th, 1917 he was taken Prisoner of War at the Battle of Monchy Le Pruex. He was disabled and honourably discharged on April 2nd, 1917.

The girl that weds a soldier Must never blench for fear; I kissed my last and looked my last Upon my lovely dear.


> The Lowlands of Flanders, Their rivers run so red. But I must say Good-bye, my dear, My only dear, I said.






Ralph Barnes Service #: JX299633


William George Butt Service #: 2294


Gordon Candow Service #: 970599






Hazen Clouter


Henley Crane Service #: 2847358






Cyril Downey Service #: 0216

The term "war bride" refers to the thousands of young women who met and married Canadian servicemen during the Second World War. These war brides were mostly from Britain, but a few thousand were also from other areas of Europe: the Netherlands, Belgium, France, Italy and Germany. During the Second World War, there were an estimated 48,000 war brides and, when the war ended, most of these young women and their children (nearly 22,000) followed their husbands to a new life in Canada.

War brides also came to Canada after the First World War. The official Government of Canada history of the First World War reports that an estimated 54,000 relatives accompanied the returning troops during demobilization from Britain to Canada.

The story of the Canadian war brides and their journey to Canada is one of the most fascinating and romantic of World War Two. Why nearly 45,000 British and European women would leave behind everything that was familiar to start a new life in post-war Canada is a story worth telling.

The war brides came from all over the United Kingdom and from nearly every country on the European continent, but the vast majority (93%) were British - and the reasons are fairly obvious. Canadians were among the first to come to the assistance of Britain after war was declared in 1939 and they spent more time there than any other member of the Allied Forces.

In fact, just 43 days after Canadian soldiers arrived in December, 1939, they celebrated the first marriage between a British woman and a Canadian serviceman at Farnborough Church in the Aldershot area.

That marriage, and the 48,000 which followed over the next six years, formed part of the most unusual emigrant wave to hit Canada's shores: All women, all of the same generation, and mostly British, these nearly 45,000 war brides are an important part of Canadian history that has gone relatively unnoticed by historians and journalists alike .

As a group, the war brides shared many similarities: but far and above the image of a British war bride with her loveable accent and tea cosy, these women represented a diversity of experience that makes them as different from one another as they are to other immigrant groups in the post-war era.

But whether they were English, Scottish, Irish, Welsh, Dutch, French, Belgian or Italian, the War Brides have the shared experience of meeting and marrying a Canadian soldier during war time, leaving their home country for a new world by trans-Atlantic ship across the ocean, crossing Canada by war bride train, settling in to their new homes, raising families and adapting to a new culture, language and religion at a time in our history when the future held great promise for new Canadians.

We salute this remarkable group of Canadian citizens who, for love, followed their husbands. Where their returning Veterans went, these young women followed – and made their new homes in their young and growing land. These women were welcomed to their new communities and new families. The contributions of these new Canadians would soon extend far beyond the walls of their homes as they entered into the life of their communities and enriched it with their many abilities and hard work. The years following the Second World War were ones of unprecedented change for Canada and our country's war brides have played an important part in the growth and development of the free and peaceful Canada that we enjoy today.

Many Canadian families and communities count themselves the richer for the contributions of the thousands of war brides, both of the First and the Second World War, who have made Canada their home.


